Saint John Vianney Relic Pilgrimage Coming to Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown

The Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown has been selected as one of the stops in the national Saint John Vianney Relic Pilgrimage. The Incorrupt Heart of Saint John Vianney, patron saint of priests, will be present at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Altoona on January 31. The faithful will have the extraordinary opportunity to venerate the relic throughout the day between 7:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. The Cathedral's usual daily Mass schedule—6:45 a.m., 8:00 a.m., and Noon—will remain in place with the addition of a concelebrated Mass at 5:30 p.m. with Bishop Mark Bartchak presiding. Priests will be available throughout the day to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. A special indulgence has been granted to all those who will make the pilgrimage to the Cathedral for veneration of the first class relic of Saint John Vianney, patron of priests.

Deacon Jim's "A Moment with Our Lady"

Our Lady of Altigracia (Our Lady of High Grace) is the spiritual Mother of the Dominican people. Her feast day, January 21st, is also the national holiday of the Dominican Republic. The Basilica of Our Lady of Altigracia stands in the heart of the city of Higüey, 110 miles from Santo Domingo, the capital.

The shrine is also known as Our Lady of the Nina, after the name of a young girl. The girl's father was a Spanish colonist who used to travel to the city of Ozama to do his errands. Nina, aged 14, had asked him to bring her back a picture of Our Lady of "High Grace," but he almost returned home without having found it. Stopping at an inn, he confided his disappointment to an old friend. A stranger came up to him and produced a painting of Our Lady of "High Grace" from his traveling bag. The Virgin is depicted in prayer before the Child Jesus, with Saint Joseph standing behind her.

Overjoyed, the father asked to buy it, but the mysterious figure gave it to him for free, then left. Nina came to meet her father in Higüey, on a January 21st. Today's shrine marks the spot where father and daughter met.

Tuesday, January 22, all dioceses in the United States of America are observing a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children.

January 22 is the day of the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision, *Roe vs. Wade (1973)*, the Church in America prays for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee to the right to life. Members of the Diocese are encouraged to go to Mass on this day, pray the rosary, the chaplet of Divine Mercy, fast and abstain, and join the Altoona-Johnstown family in praying the following:
