FROM THE PASTOR

CATHOLIC APPEAL- A Good Time To Give: 201families have pledged a total of \$34,946 to the 2007 Annual Catholic Appeal. Your generosity is a splendid outpouring! Thank you to everyone who has so generously responded. All who have yet to pledge your support, please do so now. The participation of 23% of our households has put us at 69% of the diocesan goal of \$50,373. This is excellent for the first month of the Appeal.

Your ACA gift supports our parish and our diocesan ministries. Our parishioners benefit from these and other diocesan ministries: Camp Zacchaeus, Priests Formation, Christian Initiation, Lay Ministry, and Catholic Charities. The parish projects under consideration are: (1) The replacement of the carpet in the choir loft. The nap has become threadbare in several locations. (2) The regrading and renewed paving of the parking inlet between the church and rectory. This parking/drainage area has subsided besides braking apart. With everyone's help we will both exceed our diocesan assigned goal and address the carpeting and paving projects. Bids on these two local projects total \$7,500.

Every gift, no matter the amount, is vital to the success of the Annual Catholic Appeal not only for these ministries, but for our own parish as well. We anticipate increased parishioner participation. In recent years, we have grown from twenty-seven to thirty-five percent participation.

A special thanks to the appeal captains who will cordially extend friendly phone reminders. They will tell people that we appreciate every parishioner's gift. The captains will begin calling during third week of June. Please give freely and generously as your means permit. First time participants to the Appeal may choose a gift of \$100 or you may want to match last year's average Saint Rose gift of \$178. Thank you for your prayers and your generous support for the Annual Catholic Appeal and our special parish repair projects.

SAINT COLUMBA

FEAST DAY: June 9

PATRONAGE: against floods, for poets, bookbinders, and patron of Scotland.

PROFILE: Born of Irish royalty, St. Columba was devoted from boyhood to Christianity and philosophy. At the age of 42, he sailed from Ireland to Britain, wishing to be a pilgrim for Christ. He spent most of his time in prayer, reading or writing. He wrote 300 books and served as spiritual counsel for many saints. He founded a nonastic community in Iona and served as its abbot for 12 years.

Three persons equal in majesty, undivided in splendor, yet one Lord, one God, ever to be adored in everlasting glory.
