**FROM THE PASTOR**

**CATHOLIC APPEAL- A Good Time To Give:** 225 families have pledged a total of \$37,937.70 to the 2007 Annual Catholic Appeal. Your generosity is a splendid outpouring! Thank you to everyone who has so generously responded. All who have yet to pledge your support, please do so now. The participation of 23% of our households has put us at 69% of the diocesan goal of \$50,373. This is excellent for the first month of the Appeal.

Your ACA gift supports our parish and our diocesan ministries. Our parishioners benefit from these and other diocesan ministries: Camp Zacchaeus, Priests Formation, Christian Initiation, Lay Ministry, and Catholic Charities. The parish projects under consideration are: (1) The replacement of the carpet in the choir loft. The nap has become threadbare in several locations. (2) The regrading and renewed paving of the parking inlet between the church and rectory. This parking/drainage area has subsided besides breaking apart. With everyone's help we will both exceed our diocesan assigned goal and address the carpeting and paving projects. Bids on these two local projects total \$7,500.

Every gift, no matter the amount, is vital to the success of the Annual Catholic Appeal not only for these ministries, but for our own parish as well. We anticipate increased parishioner participation. In recent years, we have grown from twenty-seven to thirty-five percent participation.

A special thanks to the appeal captains who will cordially extend friendly phone reminders. They will tell people that we appreciate every parishioner's gift. The captains will begin calling during third week of June.

In the universal Church's liturgical calendar where the solemnity of Corpus Christi is not observed as a holy day of obligation, it is assigned to a Sunday which is considered its proper day in the annual calendar. The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ in the United States is placed on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday. On this day the Church celebrated the great Sacrament given to us by the Lord Jesus on the night before he died. As we eat his Body which he gave for

### **COMMITMENT IN MARRIAGE AND BEYOND**

If you saw the movie "Cocoon" you remember the plot about aliens who manage to give new youth and vigor to some senior citizens. One of the men, feeling spry and vital, almost wrecks his marriage by being unfaithful to his wife. After a severing, he asks for and receives forgiveness.

A major theme of the movie is that age has some benefits which youth misses (and vice versa). One of the benefits of long years of life is the trust and fidelity which can arise between two people who have known each other for decades.

That trust includes husbands and wives, friends, co-workers, and neighbors.

Such fidelity, born of mutual attraction and nurtured by time, leads to security. When we know we can trust another, we are secure in our feelings and, almost paradoxically, are able to be more open to others for we are unafraid of how they might affect our relationship with our loved one.

Infidelity brings the opposite: it leads to solitude and worry, aloneness and a feeling of insecurity.

"Cocoon" showed many faithful relationships—among a trio of men, among several couples, within marriages, between an old man and his grandson, among the residents of a senior citizen complex.

When fidelity was present in those relationships, there was happiness, security and trust. When it was removed, trouble followed.

Examine your own relationships. Measure them for their fidelity quotient. How faithful are you in all senses of the word? How trusting? How secure? Consider what you can do to bring more security into your life and the lives of those around you.
