### TRIP TO ST. JOSEPH'S MISSION CHURCH AT HART'S SLEEPING PLACE

Fr. Spishak and the Adult Enrichment Committee of the parish invite you to join us for an outing to Hart's Sleeping Place. Hart's Sleeping Place is named for the trader, John Hart, who traveled the Kittanning Path in the 1700's, sleeping in a hollow tree which stood there. It is said that when there was likely trouble from unfriendly Indians passing through, that the friendly Indians would stick a red tomahawk in the tree, thereby warning Hart and he should sleep elsewhere until it was safe. The tree is long gone, and today there is a monument standing where the tree stood 2 centuries ago. In 1830, St. Joseph's Mission Church

was built on that site and was blessed in October of that year by the Prince-Priest of the Alleghenies, Demetrius Gallitzin. This tiny old log church served as the cradle of Catholicism in Northern Cambria County and Prince Gallitzin often celebrated Mass there. The church is now maintained by the diocese and is one of Cambria County's notable historic landmarks. Standing alone in the countryside, it is surrounded by graves of early settlers.

Although the church is open to the public only on very special occasions. Fr. Spishak has obtained permission to take a group of people and celebrate Mass. After Mass, Fr. Spishak will give a short talk on the history of the place, and sandwiches and beverages will be served.

Date for the Mass at St. Joseph's Mission Church is April 27, 2004. We will meet in the parking lots between Kopp's Drug and Bennigan's at 5:15 p.m. and will then car pool to the church. Reservations are limited to 50 people. Call Leona at the Rectory (944-8509). No charge for this pilgrimage.

### ○ BLESSED ALLELUIA OF HEAVEN!

Throughout Lent we refrain from singing or even saying Alleluia, but on Easter this ancient song of praise rings out. Bring this glorious Alleluia home with you after Mass. Throughout Easter day, observe an ancient tradition and greet one another with "Alleluia, praise the Lord." Borrow a Russian tradition and give family members small bells to ring whenever the word *Alleluia* is said. (Children have great fun with this, ringing their bells all day long). Sing Alleluia to the tune of favorite rounds before your Easter meal or to the tune of a lullaby at bedtime. Saint Augustine, commenting on Psalm 148, writes: "This is the meaning of the salutation which we exchange these days: 'Alleluia, praise the Lord!' You say this to your neighbors and they say this in reply. All of us have these words on our lips, all of us are praising God. But we need to praise him with all our being; not only with our lips, not only with our voice, but with our thoughts, with our whole life, with all our works." How joyful our lives would be if even our innermost thoughts were ever-singing God's praise.

On this, the highest feast of the church year, we give ourselves to joyful, unceasing praise. Today's feasting and songs of praise are practice for the abundant, joyful life of heaven. Saint Augustine's beautiful words say it well: "O blessed Alleluia of heaven! No more anguish, no more adversity, No more enemy. No more love of destruction. Up above, praise to God, and here below, praise to God. Praise mingled with fear here, but without disturbance above. Here the one who chants must die, but there he will live for ever. Here we chant in hope, there, in possession; here it is Alleluia en route, there it is Alleluia on arriving home."

Monday, April 12

## THE JOY OF FEASTING

The lenten fast takes 40 days; but Easter feasting is supposed to last a full 50 days. In the early days of Christianity all of Easter week was a continuous feast. A recent study found that the average American family dinner lasts 15 to 20 minutes. That's less than two hours a week. Have we forgotten how to feast? If we have difficulty sitting down for more than 15 minutes to eat dinner with our family, how are we going to celebrate the resurrection for the 50 days of Eastertime? Celebrate the resurrection by extending your dinnertime, or pick one day a week (perhaps Sunday, which is called a "little Easter") for a leisurely and joyful meal.

## THE JOY OF BAPTISM

The Easter season is a time to celebrate our baptism. In central and eastern Europe, this is traditionally done on Easter Monday and Tuesday by sprinkling each other with water, saying "May you never wither." Any parent who has invited children to participate in this sprinkling ritual will soon discover that water is an irresistible invitation to play. Soon everyone is joining in the fun and splashing each other. What better way to express the joy of our new life in Christ?

## WALKING WITH CHRIST

The story of Christ's appearance to his friends on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35) inspired the Easter week tradition of Emmaus walks. Weather permitting, pack a picnic lunch and head for a park. Invite friends to join you for a parade with funny Easter hats and hearty singing or, simply, a quiet stroll.

## SINGING OUR JOY

A Jewish saying suggests that those who sing pray twice. Try singing, instead of saying, your grace during this season. This grace can be sung to the tune of "Praise God from whom all blessings flow."

May feast in paradise with thee.*

## SORROW TURNED TO JOY

Before his passion and death, Jesus assures his disciples that their sorrow will turn to joy (John 16:20). In his book *Joy* (Herder and Herder, 1968) Louis Evely writes that "Christian joy is not an easy contentment, a naive self-satisfaction, or even a naive satisfaction for the sake of others. It is a sadness overcome." This is the sadness of Mary of Magdala, who stands weeping at the empty tomb, transformed into joy when she recognizes the risen Christ. Have we experienced a sadness overcome? Has an experience of grief or loss been transformed into acceptance and peace? Has a difficult struggle become a source of blessing? These are Easter joys for which we give thanks.

## SIMPLE JOYS

Fresh fish cooked over an open fire and good bread seasoned with fellowship, wonder, and joy were the first resurrection meals. The risen Christ enters into the lives of his followers, and into our lives, with great simplicity. Easter is a season to savor the simple joys of daily life where we are most likely to meet our risen Lord. When was the last time you watched a sunrise, gazed at the stars, blew bubbles, toasted marshmallows, or went walking with a friend? C. S. Lewis once wrote that "Joy is the serious business of heaven." During the Easter season, make time for this heavenly work.
