STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS - Body & Blood of Christ

“In the Eucharist, Christians reaffirm their participation in the New Covenant; they give thanks to God for blessings received; and they strengthen their bonds of commitment to one another as members of the covenant community Jesus forms.” (Stewardship: A Disciple’s Response; USCCB; 1993).

LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

At the heart of the Eucharistic Prayer, the account of the Last Supper is recited. Everything for which God has been thanked and praised – all that was accomplished in the history of salvation – is summed up and made present in the person of the crucified and risen Lord. The words of Jesus, in which he gave himself to his disciples as their food and drink, are repeated in fidelity to his command that they carry on this holy mystery. In the power of the Holy Spirit, these words achieve what they promise and express: the presence of Christ and his sacrifice among his people assembled in his name. The Diocesan Cathedral bears the title of “The Blessed Sacrament”. We are indeed a people nourished on our journey to the kingdom with the Body and Blood of the Lord. *Introduction to the Order of Mass* Number 119
