Praying With Scripture

The Sunday Scripture readings provide excellent inspiration for prayer. Can we go wrong with God's Word? For example, in the fifteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time, cycle C; the Gospel is the parable of the Good Samaritan, Luke 10:29-17. Read the story with your children. Imagine yourself being a person in the story, and invite you children to do the same. Talk about the thoughts and feelings that family members have. Discuss how family members can be “good Samaritans” on the job, in school, in the home, in your neighborhood and community. Then ask God to help your family live the gospel message faithfully.
