Liturgical Reflection...In place of the Act of Penance, especially on the Sundays of Easter and on the Baptism of the Lord, the Church offers the Rite of Blessing and Sprinkling of Water. As the People of God assemble, they are attentive to the risen Christ. In so doing, they recognize themselves both as reconciled sinners and as those in need of forgiveness of personal sins committed daily. The Blessing and sprinkling of water serves as a memorial of Easter and Baptism. God is thanked for intervening to save us through the medium of water and is asked to continue to give forgiveness and life. If the greeting and blessing take place at the church door, the priest may sprinkle the people during the entrance procession. So that the rite of sprinkling may clearly point to a renewal of the cleansing waters of Baptism, a sufficient amount of water is used.
