LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

The introductory rites at Mass conclude with the first of three orations prayed by the priest presider. This Collect, or Opening Prayer, completes the opening rites. After the invitation "Let us pray," all observe some moments of silence in which they place themselves in God's presence and pray. Through petition to God, this prayer sets the tone of the celebration and prepares all present to hear the word of God. The Roman Missal contains the prayers of the day's Mass. With the exception of Masses with children, the priest presider may not at any time alter the words of the Opening Prayer. This opening prayer may be sung at Sunday Mass and on solemnities. This prayer gathers all those assembled into one community of faith now ready to hear the word of God proclaimed from the ambo.
