DEFINITION OF TERMS

REPENTANCE

The sorrow for sins is called repentance. In the Old and New Testament repentance means a “conversion”, a “change of heart”, “turning to God”, or a “returning to him” (Is. 31:6; Hos.6:1-4; Jl. 6:12-17).

True repentance is the work of God's mercy.

(cf.Lk. 24-47; Jn. 20:21-23; see also Jas. 5: 16-20).

It is interior (Is. 58:5-7; Rom. 2:29; Gal. 5:6, Col. 2:11). But it is also manifested by men through their acts of repentance that come with the granting of grace by God.

(Acts 3:19; Eph. 4:20-24; 1 Jn. 1:18-10).

It is also because of man's response to the grace of God that there is joy in heaven, and if in heaven assuredly on earth. (Lk. 15: 1-10; Lv. 23:39-43).

CATHOLIC EDUCATION FINANCIAL AID FACTS:

The Second Century Fund has been established by the diocese to primarily support our Catholic grade schools, and is funded through tax credits to participating businesses through the state. Over \$300,000 was given to Catholic school students last year alone, with more available this year. Nearly 1,000 students in Catholic elementary schools received a Second Century Fund grant last year. BGHS granted over \$50,000 in alumni scholarships to students last year to allow them to pursue a Catholic secondary education. This is in addition to Diocesan financial aid.
