THE HOLY FAMILY Jesus, Mary and Joseph model family living for us. As an obedient child, Jesus was nurtured in the love of his home. Sunday after Sunday, Catholics gather for the holy sacrifice of the Mass. As families journey through the early years of life, it is the Eucharist that grounds us in the love of God. Fed at the table of God's word and at the altar with the Food of salvation, each family is strengthened to meet the challenges of living the message of Jesus Christ. As the family sits at the table at home to be nourished and renewed in love, so at Mass the family gathers at the holy altar to be sacramentally nourished and renewed in love.

is not a holy day of obligation this year. Because this solemnity falls on a Saturday, the obligation is withdrawn. Parishes are encouraged to offer Mass a time convenient for the Faithful on this day. Mary, Mother of God, is the most ancient title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in Christian tradition. Mary's position in salvation history is her cooperation with God by saying "Yes" to the call to be God's mother. Mary's response to God models the response of every Christian. Today is a Day of Prayer For World Justice and Peace in our Diocese.

God our Father, Creator of the world, You guide all creation with love. In your infinite wisdom You have established the order which governs all the ages. CATHOLICS RETURNING HOME

Do you know someone who has left the Church? Most of us do not have to look very far to find nonpracticing Catholics in our circle of family and friends. Many of us are concerned about these

loved ones, but we don't know how to help them. Obviously, most of them are searching, but how can we help them find their way home?

As baptized, practicing Catholics, we have a precious gift of faith and love from the Lord that needs to be shared with our nonpracticing brothers and sisters. First, we need to pray for them. Next, we need to extend a personal invitation to them to come home to the Catholic Church. Most nonpracticing Catholics are waiting for an invitation to return. Many mistakenly think they are excommunicated and are not welcome to return for a variety of reasons.

Many nonpracticing Catholics carry with them a tremendous amount of guilt and misinformation about the Church and are afraid of approaching the Church for fear of being rejected. You can make a tremendous difference in someone's life simply by reaching out to them and telling them that we miss them and would like for them to come back home to our Church family.

Here at St. Rose of Lima we have a special program to help nonpracticing Catholics return to the Church entitled "Catholic Come Home." 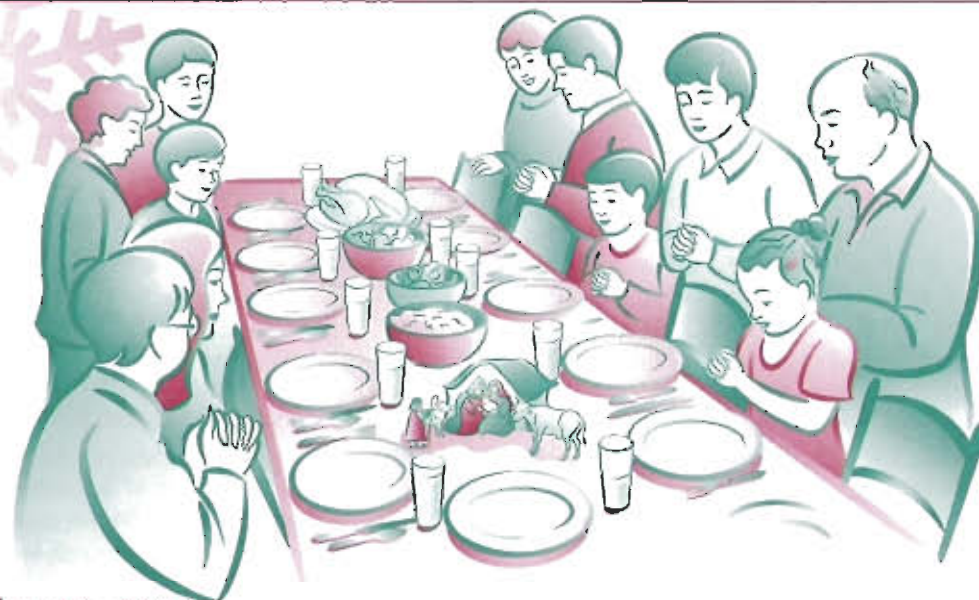
A Family Blessing

The Holy Family and Our Spiritual Journey

The feast of the Holy Family became a special devotion in the seventeenth century and was made a feast of the whole Church by Pope Benedict XV around 1893. Traditionally, the feast celebrates the family of Mary, Joseph, and Jesus as the role model for all Christian households. By showing the virtues of charity, obedience, and mutual help, the Holy Family guides the actions of all families as they move closer to God.

Jesus began his human journey with God as a boy in his family, and it was the holy couple's loving care for each other and Jesus that helped them grow in understanding and intimacy with God. Our families do the same for us. When we form a loving bond and commit

ourselves to live with others, we create an opportunity for everyone to begin (or continue) a journey to God. Birth families, adoptive families, families formed by extended relatives or single parents can all be holy families when love is central. Such families can make the presence of God evident to the greater Christian community.

God has given every one of us grace to experience our spiritual journey in the context of families. If we are lucky, it begins the moment we are born, but, as Catholics, we have the unique opportunity to be family for everyone in the Church. Whether we are child, mother, or father, we help each other see the wonder and joy of being a child of God. The Holy Family shows us how to do that.

Monday, December 27

A Feast for Friends

The feast of John the apostle might well be titled the feast of friendship. John is the beloved disciple, the one who rested his head against Jesus at the Last Supper. Legend also designates him as the writer of the Gospel and the book of Revelation. John is the patron saint of many places and things including Asia Minor and art dealers, but because of his closeness to Jesus, John has been designated also as the patron saint of friendship. When two people are close friends, the love of God for one can be made visible in the other. Call a close friend today and share your gratitude for his or her friendship.

Tuesday, December 28

Holy Innocents

When Jesus was born, Herod was so afraid of the possibility of a new king that he ordered all the male babies of Bethlehem killed. Learning of this, Joseph took Jesus and Mary to Egypt to escape from Herod. The feast of the Holy Innocents reminds us that many children in the world suffer because the adults in their world cannot or will not care for them. Wednesday, December 29

An In-Between Time

The week after Christmas and before New Year's eve seems like an in-between time. The excitement of Christmas is past; New Year's eve and day have not yet happened. This lull in the excitement allows people to get their bearings again. It also provides an opportunity for children and parents to spend some time together before the holiday is over. Make tonight a family night by reading a special story together, playing a board game, or working on a puzzle.

Thursday, December 30

Knowing Jesus When We See Him

Anna, the prophet of Jerusalem, had talked about the coming of the Messiah for many years and recognized Jesus when Mary and Joseph brought him to the temple. Her insight came as a result of prayer, and her thanksgiving came from the joy of seeing the prophecy fulfilled. This evening, pray together that you might know Jesus when you see him in others.

Friday, December 31

New Year's Eve

On New Year's eve we have many traditions designed to bring good fortune in the new year. The Spanish eat 12 grapes when the clock strikes at midnight; the French eat a stack of pancakes for luck and health. Bolivian families make wood or straw dolls, and Armenian women bake a special bread. In America we often make resolutions to correct some flaw and wish each other well at parties. As Catholics, we might also think about ringing in the new year with Mass on New Year's eve. Check the schedule at your parish.

Feast of Mary, the Mother of God

It seems fitting that we devote one day to Mary in her role as the mother of Jesus. Luke's Gospel tells us that she pondered in her heart everything she heard about Jesus (2:16–21).
