ANNUAL APPEAL: Thank you, thank you. We are off to an outstandingly strong start thanks to the generous gifts from 21% of our parish families. We have raised \$33,082 toward our diocesan goal of \$51,053 and overall goal of 68,053 (includes the new rectory roof). Your gift, no matter the amount, is vital to the success of the Annual Catholic Appeal not only for these ministries, but for our own parish as well. All gifts more than our diocesan goal will go for the replacement of our nearly thirty-year-old rectory roof. We look forward to **every household's participation** in this year's appeal. 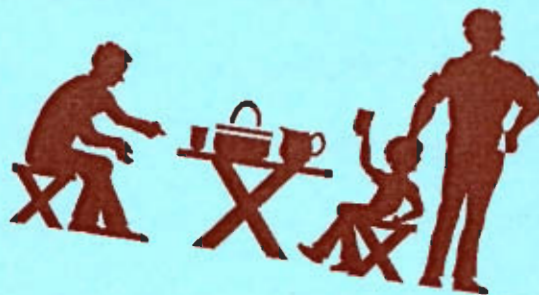

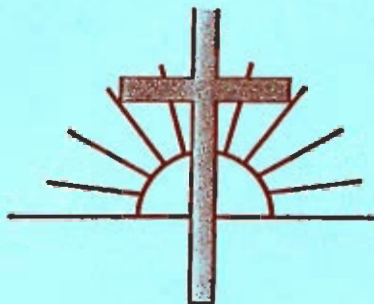
