"In Search of a Round Table", by Chuck Lathrop

It has much to say to us as we continue our pursuit of a shared wisdom model of Church

Concerning the shy and how and what and who of ministry,
one image keeps surfacing:
A Table that is round.

Such redoing and rebirthing
of narrowlong Churching
