“IN DEFENSE OF LIFE”

“The intrinsic value and personal dignity of every human being does not change depending on their circumstances.” Pope John Paul II taught, “Providing food and water to such patients should be a natural thing to do and ‘morally obligatory,’ but not considered extraordinary measures,” he said. “In particular, I want to emphasize that the administration of water and food...always represents a natural means of preservation of life, not a medical treatment. Removing the feeding tube of a disabled person is a serious violation of the Law of God.”

LITURGICAL REFLECTION..The elements of bread and wine are carried in the procession in vessels that can easily be seen. The bread and wine should each be contained in a single vessel, so that priest and people may be seen to be sharing the same food and drink in the sacrament of unity. The vessels used should reflect the dignity of the Sacrament. The gifts of bread, wine and money are carried forward by member of the assembly. The people's identification with the gifts is best expressed if the procession passes right through their midst. The gifts are accepted by the priest. The collection of money and other gifts for the needy is deposited near the altar or in another suitable place. Only the sacred vessels containing the bread and wine are place on the altar.
