Antiphonal Communion hymns aid the procession, as the cantor or choir may sing the verses and the Faithful join in singing the common refrain. The Bulletins are designed to serve as a reminder of what was presented at the session. They also provide additional information relative to specialized issues of child sexual abuse. Since we usually only retain a portion of anything we learn, the bulletins are important tools to keep our awareness of the need to protect children current. Each year a longer re-certification bulletin is provided as an additional form of review.
