### PRAYER CORNER

Friday, July 14, 2006 is the feast day of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha. She is the first Native American to be beatified. She is also called "Lily of the Mohawks"

Her mother was a Christian Algonquin and father a non-Christian Mohawk Turtle Chief. When she was four a smallpox epidemic took the lives of her parents, brother, and left her vision severely impaired and face disfigured. She was shunned and abused by relatives for her faith. She had a strong devotion to the Eucharist, was known as a miracle

worker and spread Christianity among the Nation Americans. She and St. Rose of Lima, were both strongly influenced by St. Catherine of Siena.

### Prayer for Canonization of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha:

O God who, among the many marvels of Your Grace in the New World, did cause to blossom on the banks of the Mohawk and of the St. Lawrence, the pure and tender, Lily, Kateri Tekakwitha, grant we beseech You, the favor of Jesus and of His Cross may soon be counted among her Saints by Holy Mother Church, and that our hearts may be enkindled with a stronger desire to imitate her innocence and faith.

Through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen
