**FROM THE PASTOR**

**CATHOLIC APPEAL- Nearing Our Goal:** 297 families have pledged a total of \$40,145 to the 2006 Annual Catholic Appeal. Your generosity is a splendid outpouring! Thank you to everyone who has so generously responded. All who have yet to pledge your support, please do so within the next two weeks. The participation of 33% of our households has put us at 98% of the diocesan goal of \$51,521. Fr. Spishak and I hope that every parishioner supports this year's appeal. With everyone pulling together we can both meet our assigned goal and gather sufficient funds to replace a fifteen-year-old air condenser in our social hall. The replacement unit is cooling those who help our school and parish by coming to bingo.

We appreciate every parishioner's gift. Please give freely and generously as your means permit. First time participants to the Appeal may choose a gift of \$100 or you may want to match last year's average Saint Rose gift of \$184. Thank you for your prayers and your generous support for the Annual Catholic Appeal and the replacement of the air condenser.

One of the most intriguing aspects of the celebration of the Eucharist is the fact that it has changed so little over twenty centuries. The essential elements are found in the narrative of the institution of the Eucharist as recorded in the gospels. The liturgical structure of that celebration developed very rapidly in the early life of the Church as we see in Saint Paul's first Letter to the Corinthians (1 Corinthians 11:26), and the essential elements have remained unchanged. Even in many of the details, we find in the celebration of the liturgy today an identity with what went before us for many centuries.
