**"IN DEFENSE OF LIFE"**

Advocates of embryonic stem cell research often use diabetes, as an example of a disease that their unethical research will cure some day. California has even set aside taxpayer money to fund this immoral medical approach. How ironic, then, that in California the LaJolla Institute for Allergy and Immunology is set to begin a vaccine-based treatment of Type I diabetes in humans before the end of this year. This is yet another example of how medical

research is coming up with ethical treatments of devastating diseases at a time when embryonic stem cell research has yet to produce any usable results. (*Journal of Clinical Investigation*, 4/21.06 online version.)

### Liturgical Reflection...

Regarding the uniform posture of all at Mass, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal states, "A common posture...both expresses and fosters the intention and spiritual attitude of the participants" (Number 42). Lastly, the Instruction talks of the posture of KNEELING. In the United States, Catholic kneel after the singing of the Holy, Holy until the Great Amen. On those rare occasions when kneeling is not possible or practical (for example, lack of space or large number of people present or some other good reason), those who do not kneel ought to make a profound bow when the priest genuflects after the consecration of the bread and wine. (Other than for reasons of health, a Catholic should never sit during the consecration.) The Faithful kneel after the Lamb of God in our Diocese. KNEELING is a ritual posture that fosters adoration and our dependence on God.
