Liturgical Reflection...

Catholics join in the common postures of standing, sitting, and kneeling at Mass. The Church directs in the General Instruction of the *Roman Missal* that sacred SILENCE is an essential part of the Liturgy. The purpose of silence depends on the time it occurs in the Mass. During the Act of Penitence and again after the invitation to pray, all silently recollect themselves. At the conclusion of the first two scriptural readings, the homily, and after the reception of Communion with the Communion song, silence allows those assembled to praise and thank God in their hearts. Silence is an important part of the Roman Rite.
