Liturgical Reflection...

In addition to the liturgical postures of standing, sitting, and kneeling, liturgical gestures also express the unity of God's people gathered for the holy sacrifice of the Mass. The most familiar gesture for Catholics is the SIGN OF THE CROSS. This gesture begins Mass and, in the form of a blessing, concludes the sacred Liturgy. The Faithful also sign their forehead, lips, and heart prior to the proclamation of the Gospel. The cross is the central sign of Christianity; on the wood of Calvary Christ won our salvation and the forgiveness of sins. Making the sign of the cross should always be done with reverence and thought.
