Liturgical Reflection...

In addition to the liturgical gesture of the sign of the cross, Catholics are directed to strike our breasts during the *Confess* at the words, "through my own fault". This ritual gesture strengthens the awareness that my sin is my own free choice to offend God and others. In the *Creed* we are directed to make a bow at the words, "by the power of the Holy Spirit He was born of the Virgin Mary." This ritual gesture signifies our profound respect and gratitude to Christ who, though God, did not hesitate to come among us as a human being, sharing our human condition in order to save us from sin and restore us to friendship with God.

Liturgical Reflection...

This Wednesday, November 1, is a holy day of obligation for Catholics. This solemnity originated in the east; in the fourth century there are recordings of the feast of All Martyrs. Pope Gregory IV established this commemoration for the Roman Church in the ninth century. We remember the holy men, women and children who preceded us in death and are now in the eternal kingdom of God's love. Many remain unnamed.
