### SAINT JOAN OF ARC

**FEAST DAY: May 30**

**PATRONAGE: Captives, martyrs, people ridiculed for their piety, soldiers, WAC's, WAVES.**

**PROFILE:** St. Joan was one of 5 children born to Jacques d'Arc and Isabelle Romee. At a very young age she became a shepherdess and was known as a mystic. She received visions from St. Margaret of Antioch, Saint Catherine of Alexandria, and Michael the Archangel from the age of 13. In the early 15<sup>th</sup> century, England controlled most of France. In 1428 Joan's visions told her to find the true

King of France and help him reclaim his throne. Her many victories in battle brought Charles VII to the throne. Joan was captured and sold to the English for 10 thousand francs. She was tried and convicted of heresy. On May 30, 1431 Joan was burned alive. In 1456 her case was re-tried, and Joan was acquitted, 23 years too late!

She is famous for her quote :

"About Jesus Christ and the Church, I simply know they're just one thing, and we shouldn't complicate the matter."
