"IN DEFENSE OF LIFE"

In the Supreme Court's recent decision upholding a ban on partial birth abortion, Justice Anthony Kennedy

wrote for the majority: "While we find no reliable data to measure the phenomenon, it seems unexceptionable to conclude some women come to regret their choice to abort the infant life they once created and sustained. Severe depression and loss of esteem can follow." Given those stakes, "the state has an interest in ensuring so grave a choice is well informed."

LITURGICAL REFLECTION...In renewing the liturgical calendar, the Church in 1969 prioritized the seasons of the annual calendar. First and foremost, Sunday is the primary holy day for Christians because this is the day of resurrection. Easter and the Holy Triduum are at the heart of the liturgical year, and most subsequent dates fall in line with the annual celebration of Easter. The Easter season of fifty-days is preceded by the forty days of Lent. The Church then speaks of the Christmas season along with Advent. The thirty-three Sundays of Ordinary Time follow these particular seasons. The liturgical calendar commemorates the saving events of Jesus Christ, especially his death and resurrection
