**FROM THE PASTOR**

**CATHOLIC APPEAL** - A Significant Surge: two hundred twenty-eight families have pledged a total of \$36,929 to the 2009 Annual Catholic Appeal. Your generosity is a splendid outpouring! Thank you to everyone who has so generously responded. All who have yet to pledge your support, please do so now. The participation of 28% of our households has put us at 73% of the diocesan goal of \$50,101.

Your ACA gift supports our parish and our diocesan ministries. Our parishioners benefit from these and other diocesan ministries: Camp Zacchaeus, Christian Initiation, Lay Ministry, Faith Formation, and Catholic Charities. This year our local project is our completely paying for the long-sought house and garage placed amid our Sixth Avenue parking lots. Father Spishak successfully conducted a phone campaign that generated 90% of this property that we have wanted to get for more than fifty years ago. Exceeding our assigned diocesan goal by \$6,000 will complete the full payment for the "house-in-our-parking-lot."

### MISSION CO-OP APPEAL

Father Michael L. Komakec, representing the Archdiocese of Gula will speak at all the Masses next weekend. Here is some information on the Archdiocese of Gula and the reason they are in need of your prayers and financial help

The Archdiocese of Gulu is in northern Uganda in East Africa and it is under the leadership of Archbishop John Baptist Odama. In size, the Archdiocese of Gula is currently the largest diocese in Uganda. It occupies a territory of about 28,800 sq.km, and it is divided into 25 Parishes. Each of those parishes have at least 10 Mission churches. Our Archdiocese has about 1.20 million people, of which about 800,00 are Roman Catholics. Since 1986 the Archdiocese of Gulu has been seriously affected by an ongoing war in northern Uganda and southern Sudan. Gulu Archdiocese, bordering Uganda and Sudan has been caught in the middle of a series of conflicts between the LRA rebels from Sudan and Uganda government for about 22 years. The war has severely affected missionary work in our diocese and the whole region of northern Uganda and southern Sudan. We lost thousands of lives and property during the conflict. More than 80% of our population was forced to abandon their homes and take refuge in refugee camps in their own country under very inhuman conditions without enough food, clothing, medication and many more essential requirement.

### LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

Today is the great Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. At the heart of Catholic life is belief in the sacramental presence of our Lord Jesus Christ in bread and wine that has become his very Body and Blood. The singing of the people should be preeminent as they process to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord. The Communion song should possess themes of joy, wonder, unity, gratitude, and praise. Following ancient Roman liturgical tradition, the Communion song might reflect themes of the Gospel reading of the day. It is also appropriate to select a Communion processional hymn that reflects the liturgical action, i.e. eating and drinking the Body and Blood of Christ.
