LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

Christians have invoked the name of God over the centuries as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Almighty is a trinity of persons yet one eternal God. The Creed that Americans usually pray at Mass is the Nicene Creed. In the revised Roman Missal the words we say to profess our faith will be changing, but our faith is staying the same. Catholics will probably notice more changes in this text than in any other words you say at Mass. The guiding principle for the revised translation is to make the English closer to the Latin original.
