### MISSION CO-OP COLLECTION HAITI MISSIONS - HANDS TOGETHER

Each year the Society for the Propagation of the Faith invites a mission group to speak at all the Masses at each parish in the United States. It is called Missionary Cooperative Appeal, and it is a chance for us to talk about what is going on with our brothers and sisters in other parts of the world. This year the Diocese has invited Hands Together to make an appeal. Hands Together works alongside the Catholic Missions in one of the most desperate areas of the world: Haiti. In Haiti there are 7 million people in an area smaller than Maryland. 70% of these cannot read, and 85% live below poverty level. In slum areas 4 out of 5 children do not reach the ages of five, and nationally 1 in 3 children is chronically malnourished. Hands Together sponsors school, orphanages, elderly care facilities, hospices and clinics. In addition to providing food at each of its schools and orphanages, they also run an emergency relief food program. **Next weekend July 10-11, John Klein will be speaking on behalf of Hands Together. He will give an inspiring and educational presentation. Please use the envelope attached to today's Bulletin.**

### MASS SCHEDULE CHANGES

- \* the Saturday evening Mass will be at 4:00 p.m.
- \* We will no longer have Mass at 7:00 a.m. on Sunday, and will move the 8:15 to 8:00. This change should also help with CCD.
- \* We will also no longer have Mass Saturday mornings.

These changes will take effect the weekend of July 31 and August 1. **Our new schedule will be: Saturday 4:00 p.m., Sunday 8:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 12 Noon.** We apologize for the inconvenience this may cause some, but it was felt that these are necessary changes.
