While in the past, we had the benefit of other priests in residence or willing to help with a Mass or two, it has become much more difficult to find coverage, and our current schedule is difficult for one priest to handle. The following changes were felt to best fit our current situation:

- * the Saturday evening Mass will be at 4:00 p.m.
- * We will no longer have Mass at 7:00 a.m. on Sunday, and will move the 8:15 to 8:00. This change should also help with CCD.
- * We will also no longer have Mass Saturday mornings.

These changes will take effect the weekend of July 31 and August 1. **Our new schedule will be: Saturday 4:00 p.m., Sunday 8:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 12 Noon.** We apologize for the inconvenience this may cause some, but it was felt that these are necessary changes.

LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

Longer sentences will appear in the English translation because the present translation breaks the sentences when they occur in Latin. Because the new translation stitches these phrases together again, it may be a little difficult to say and hear at first. But these longer sentences are producing prayers, that express more nuances of meaning. They will hold up over repeated usage, and they will reward those who use them for meditation and reflection. The new texts will express more clearly why we pray, why we hope, and how we present ourselves before God.
