MASS SCHEDULE CHANGES

After reviewing our current Mass schedule with the Parish Liturgy Commission and Parish Council, it has been decided that a few changes need to be made. A few of the points of consideration were the current attendance numbers, minister scheduling and finally the weekend workload when one of the priests is away. While we are blessed to have Fr. Spishak with us who is willing to help so much, he deserves his time away to enjoy his retirement. While in the past, we had the benefit of other priests in residence or willing to help with a Mass or two, it has become much more difficult to find coverage, and our current schedule is difficult for one priest to handle. The following changes were felt to best fit our current situation:

- * the Saturday evening Mass will be at 4:00 p.m.
- * We will no longer have Mass at 7:00 a.m. on Sunday, and will move the 8:15 to 8:00. This change should also help with CCD.
- * We will also no longer have Mass Saturday mornings.

These changes will take effect the weekend of July 31 and August 1. **Our new schedule will be: Saturday 4:00 p.m., Sunday 8:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 12 Noon.** We apologize for the inconvenience this may cause some, but it was felt that these are necessary changes.

MINISTRY CHANGES

With Deacon Woomer assigned to St. Rose, there will be certain changes for Readers and Eucharistic Ministers. Please stop in the Sacristy for the new directives.

I understand that the addition of Deacon Woomer to the schedule has caused some confusion, in particular with our Eucharistic Ministers. Like the priest, a deacon is considered an "ordinary" minister of Communion. This means that at Mass the priest(s) and deacon(s) are to be ministers when they are present. As with reading the Gospel and petitions, cup minister is one of the deacon's regular roles. My hope is that the deacon will simply be on the schedule in the future, but we were not able to do it this time. I apologize for the inconvenience and the confusion this has caused.

LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

The revised translation of the *Roman Missal* is trying to achieve a greater adherence to the original Latin than did former translations in the *Sacramentary*. Our first English translations used a more dynamic principle of translation, one that took some freedom with the structure and content of the Latin sentences. While at times pleasant to the ear, these early translations sacrificed some of the nuances of the original Latin text. The new translation of the *Roman Missal* will reflect not only the original Latin but also be more clearly in tune with vernacular translations throughout the universal Church.
