Deacon Jim's "A Moment with Our Lady"

We hear Mary proclaim: "His mercy is from generation to generation," a phrase that is at the heart of the Magnificat, not only because it is the center of the Song, but mostly because it is the key to it.

God's mercy reaches all his children. It is "the promise made to our fathers, to Abraham and his descendants forever." Mary contemplates and describes God's mercy through the centuries, according to that promise.

In the Magnificat, we find a strong contrast between the rich and the poor, between the powerful and the humble. We could think that God is hard on some while he consoles the others, but in fact, God is good to everyone.

Bringing down the mighty from their thrones and giving a rich person the possibility of finding themselves "empty" are the fruits of God's mercy, as surely as raising up the humble or filling the hungry with good things. God wants to bestow good things on all of us. "Sending the rich away empty, scattering the proud" is a blessing of God's mercy because the proud will stop thinking themselves superior to others and discover that they are children of God, like the others.
