LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

When the choice has been made to cremate a body, the Church recommends that the cremation take place after the Vigil for the Deceased, the Funeral Mass, and Rite of Final Commendation and Farewell. When cremation takes place, the cremated remains of the body of the deceased person are reverently taken to the cemetery for burial and the Rite of Committal. The official prayers of the Church are prayed as the cremated remains of the Christian are then formally buried. It is usually a matter of a few days between the Funeral Mass and the availability of the cremated remains for the Rite of Committal. The Rite of Committal is celebrated as soon as possible following the Funeral Liturgy.
