Deacon Jim's "A Moment with Our Lady"

In 1879, the church of Cap-de-la-Madeleine, today's Shrine of Our Lady of the Cape in Quebec, had become too small. New stone was prepared on the south shore and the parishioners prayed the Rosary for the river to freeze.

The winter continued to be mild and building was brought to a standstill. So, they planned to tear down the small church of St Angela to use its stone instead. Father Luke Desilets, their pastor, vowed to preserve the 1720 church and dedicate it to the Virgin Mary: "If you accord us ice on the river for the feast of Saint Joseph, we will not destroy your church, but we will dedicate it to your Holy Rosary," he pleaded.

No sooner said than done. On the night of March 15th, a tremendous storm blew up and a miraculous bridge of ice formed, allowing the people to carry the needed stone across the river. The bridge was narrow but caused no undue incidents, and the parishioners worked confidently while their priest recited the Rosary.

In the face of death, the Church confidently proclaims that God has created each person for eternal life and that Jesus, crucified and risen Lord, has broken the chains of sin and death that bound humanity. At the death of a Christian, whose life was begun in the waters of baptism and strengthened at the Eucharistic table, the Church intercedes on behalf of the deceased because of its confident belief that death is not the end nor does it break the bonds forged in life. The human body is to be treated with the utmost respect throughout the funerary rites. Ultimately, the body or cremated remains are to be placed in a grave, that is, a cemetery or mausoleum.
